Type: This product is an OTC Decumulator

Objective: You aim at selling shares of the Reference underlying above the current market price at a predefined value (called the Selling Price). On any Observation Date of each Observation Period, you sell a number of shares at the Selling Price. This will correspond to the Daily Number of Shares if the Reference Underlying closes at or below the Selling Price and to the Daily Number of Shares multiplied by the Selling Multiplier if the Reference Underlying closes above the Selling Price. These shares are delivered on the Settlement Date of each Observation Period. During any Observation Period, if the Reference underlying closes at or below the Knock-Out Barrier, the product is early terminated and you deliver the shares sold during this period on the Knock-Out Settlement Date.

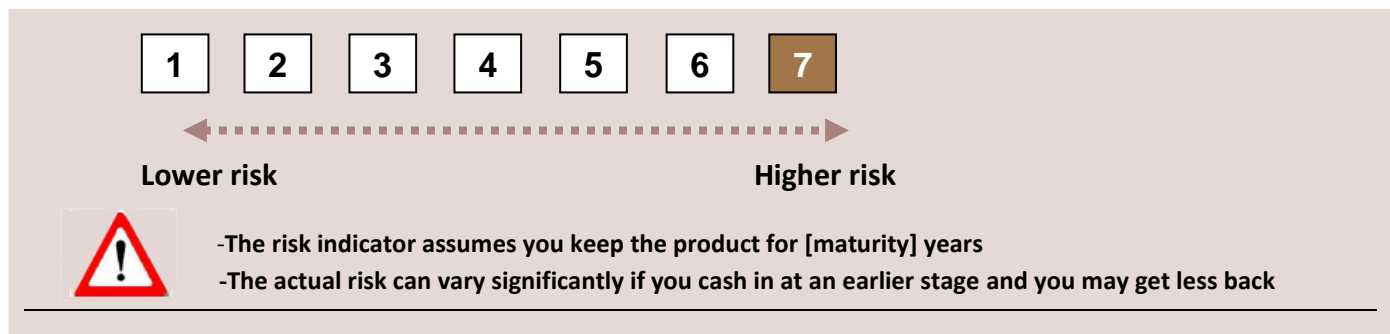
